Late Policy for Assignments:

Lab reports are due during the first five (5) minutes of class on the announced due date.

Late work will be accepted according to the following schedule:

Examples: (For example purposes, class meets every day Monday – Friday)

- A. Lab Report #1 was due on a Monday. Jack turns his in on Monday during the first five minutes. Jack earns full credit.
- B. Lab Report #2 was due on a Wednesday. Jack turns his in six (6) minutes after class starts on Wednesday. Jack's grade is reduced by 10% for being stage 1 late.
- C. Lab Report #3 was due on a Friday. Jack turns his in Tuesday during the first five minutes of class. Jack's grade is reduced by 30% for being stage 2 late.
- D. Lab Report #4 was due on a Tuesday. Jack had an excused absence on Tuesday. Jack turns in his on Friday ten minutes after the bell rings. Jack's grade is reduced by 50% for being stage 3 late.

Make-up Work: If you are absent for a test, be prepared to take a make-up test during the next class meeting. For example, Jack's class is a red day class and test #1 was given on Monday. Jack was absent Monday. The next class meeting is Wednesday. Jack will take test #1 on Wednesday. If Jack is also absent on Wednesday, he can schedule to take the test after school or take it during the test make-up day at the end of the semester.

Extra Credit: There is extra credit available on every test and lab report.

Class Work: I will do my best to provide you with meaningful bell-to-bell instruction every day that is focused on the curriculum. Although this year we have two different activity bell schedules, there may be times where you can buy tickets to attend an event during class time. Unless you are earning a high "A", you do not have my approval to miss class. I will continue teaching and you will be responsible for any missed work. If the event is for a charity which you wish to support, I recommend that you donate the price of the ticket to the charity and attend chemistry class.

On Task: On some days you will be earning points based on participation. If you are on task, you are paying attention, trying and actively participating. You are off task if you are inattentive, sleeping, head down, phone is visible, socializing, and/or working on other subjects, etc. You will also earn on task points for participating in labs. For a lab you are on task if you are working cooperatively with your lab partner, following safety rules, following lab directions (both written and verbal) and cleaning up afterwards. You are off task if you engage in horseplay, socialize, disobey safety rules and/or leave your lab station messy.

Class Rules:

- No food or drink
- Closed-toed shoes are required everyday
- No bathroom passes the first and last fifteen (15) minutes of class
- No backpacks, purses, etc. on table tops. Books and binders must be flat on desk.
- No phones visible. If your phone is visible, it will be assumed to be in use whether or not you claim it to be broken, turned off, out of battery, etc.
